RANV Summer Picnic

The RANV Summer Picnic will be on Saturday, August 13 at Kamp Kill Kare State Park.

Head up to St. Albans and take Exit 19 and continue to Route 7. Head north to the center of town and take a left on Lake Street. Continue to St. Albans Bay and head north past St. Albans Town Park to Hathaway Point Road. This road will take you to the park. Talk-in on 145.15 (131.8) and 145.23 (100.0).

On the way to the picnic, you will pass by the St. Albans Hamfest at 373 Lake Street. They will run from 8 until noon.

The picnic will start at 11AM. RANV will provide admission. However, if you have a Green Mountain Passport (many of us do), please use that. The Passport is available to anyone over 62 and allows free daytime access to all Vermont State Parks.

Drive straight into the park after checking in. We will be set up by the lake. We will provide charcoal for the grills. You bring the food and drink and whatever sporting equipment which is desired. Leave pets at home - they are not allowed.

The meeting began at 7:15

Two club members were discussing the 13 colonies program, and one remarked that there should be a ham radio Native American event as well. After a further discussion, the club will reach out to the Abnaki leadership to assess their interest in ham radio.

A discussion on future parks on the air led to several possible locations: Green River reservoir, Camel's Hump, and Lake Elmore. It was decided that the club activation will be August 20th. Farms on the air, at Bob's Tree Farm, is September 17th.

Stew gave a presentation on ham radio balloons, using GPRS to track balloons. The object is to launch a balloon, track it and retrieve it. Balloons can be a weather balloon (high altitude, a few hours at high altitudes), or a pico balloon (party size, and lower altitude).

There is software that can predict a trajectory of a balloon. Hydrogen is cheaper than helium, but a bit more dangerous. Payloads are determined by balloon size. To track a balloon, a GPRS radio is needed, larger balloons can also have a go pro camera. Pico launches can ride the jet stream – one has circumnavigated the globe more than once. Software can track any GPRS enabled balloon (tracker.habhum.org). Aprs.fi will also track all GPRS traffic. Airspace around airports is off limits.

The club picnic is August 13th at Kill Kare Park, 10:am- the club will provide charcoal and water.

Paul is bringing snacks in September.
