EMERGENCIES: WHAT TO DO WHEN THE YOU-KNOW-WHAT HITS THE FAN

Are you ready to support amateur radio's PRIME DIRECTIVE?

"Recognition and enhancement of the value of the amateur service to the public as a voluntary noncommercial communication service, particularly with respect to providing emergency communications."

Sadly, most hams are NOT ready to provide emergency communications. Ask yourself: Do you have an HT with you? Is it charged and ready to go? Do you even know how to program it without a computer? Do you have a mobile radio installed, or ready to be deployed? Do you have emergency rations handy? Do you even have any idea what to do?

Unless the answers to all of these are yes, then you really are not ready to deal with an emergency. Emergencies are NOT scheduled. They can happen at any time, even as you read this. If you are not prepared, you will be of limited usefulness. Mitch W1SJ will start the presentation, covering the preparations you will need to do to be ready for
